#### **Administration News**

#### **Change of Contact Details:**

It is absolutely critical that the school is advised immediately of any changes to parent or emergency contact details (mobile phone numbers, addresses etc). These become vital when children are unwell or injured. Prompt contact with families can avoid a lot of distress and confusion. The Department of Education does not provide accident insurance or ambulance cover for students.

The cost of any medical attention or ambulance for a student will be borne by the parent/guardian. Parents are liable for all medical expenses incurred because of student injury, including transport costs such as ambulance or air ambulance costs, which can be very expensive.

We highly recommend that all families have their ambulance subscriptions up to date. People who have a health care card are covered for ambulance transport.

#### **School Expectations:**

#### **Diaries**

This year to build consistency and students develop their organisational skills every student from Prep to Six will be receiving a school diary. Diaries can be used to communicate with teachers via a written note, please note that as per our communication policies, teachers may take 24-48 hours to respond. If you are communicating absences, it will still need to be added to Compass or through the front office. Each night we ask that student's record their nightly reading. Each year level will discuss their expectations with their classes. Unfortunately, if a diary is lost or damaged, we do not have any replacements.

#### **Uniform:**

Wearing our school uniform with pride is essential. Please ensure that you send your child/ren to school in our full school uniform. From week 3 onwards our parents and carers will begin to receive notices of incorrect uniform items. If you are unsure of our uniform policy, please visit our website. A reminder of the schools' uniform expectations – specific jewellery i.e. ear studs and sleepers can be worn, but no necklaces, bracelets or rings are to be worn. Hair ties and bows must be school colours. All students are required to wear black school shoes or black sport shoes.

#### Playgrounds & School gates:

We ask that no students or siblings are on playgrounds before or after school. Students are to walk calmly to their classrooms and wait patiently for the bell to go. There is to be no running under any undercover areas. All school gates will open each morning from 8.35am -8.50am, and open afterschool from 3.10pm -3.35pm. We ask that no children are standing or holding onto any part of the school gates. Please make sure you are on time dropping off & pick up your child/ren from school.

#### Time to speak with teacher:

We understand that there are times that parents would like to discuss certain things with their child's teacher throughout the school term. To ensure teachers are not inundated with unexpected parent conversations at the beginning and end of the day, we ask that parents make an appointment as our staff a very dedicated and attend many Professional Learning opportunities and meetings after school. They will need to schedule a time. Thank you for your understanding.

#### **Assistant Principal News**

#### Attendance:

At Cambridge Primary School we actively encourage all students to come to school every day. If children are unwell then home is the best place for them, but obviously the more time students spend at school the more learning they do. Please plan ahead and **book holidays and appointments during school holidays or after school** and avoid allowing students to stay at home for 'special' days such as birthdays or visits from extended family members. REMEMBER every learning minute counts at Cambridge Primary School and "it is not ok to be away." If your child is sick and is absent from school, please send a note to the class teacher or phone the school (9748 9011) explaining the absence. Compass can also be used for this.

#### Prep

Monday the 5<sup>th</sup> of February was the first day of school for our preps! We are very excited to welcome our new cohort to the Cambridge community and know they will do amazing things. This year prep start was a little different with the first 3 days of school being transition. This allowed us to get to know our students even better and to create classes that will best suit our learners. Our Wednesday Prep interviews will continue on the 7<sup>th</sup>, 14<sup>th</sup>, and 21<sup>st</sup> of February meaning there is no school for our preps on those days. If you haven't already booked a prep interview, please call the office.

#### **Meet & Greet**

Meet and Greet interviews will be conducted for Prep to Year 6 families from 1.00 pm to 5.30 pm on <u>Tuesday 5th March 2024</u>. Interviews will be of 10 minutes duration. Meet and Greet sessions are not for discussing academics, rather this time is used for our teachers to meet with our families to get to know what makes our students them. During this time, you may wish to share things like family dynamics, outside-of-school interests, fun facts about your family, or any other important information relating to how your child learns. Information on how to book your 10-minute session will be communicated via Compass closer to the date.

Student will be dismissed at 12.25pm on this day.

The Compass booking system will be open from Monday 19th February 2024 at 9.00 am until 4.00 pm Friday 1st March 2024.

#### **Assemblies**

#### **School Wide Positive Behaviour News**

School Wide Positive Behaviour Support or SWPBS is an evidenced based framework for responding to student behaviour. It aims to create a positive school climate, a culture of student self-regulation and an open, responsive management system for all school community members. It includes analysis of behavioural and responsive data and implementation of evidence based instructional and corrective practices. SWPBS also supports the development of safe, purposeful, and inclusive classroom environments, while providing individual behaviour and learning supports needed for all students to achieve academic and social success.

SWPBS is a collaborative effort that actively involves all staff members in a school, teachers, ES, paraprofessionals, and students.

### **School Council News**

#### **School Council Elections**

Effective school councils are a key factor in good governance. Effective councils have a wide range of skills, expertise, and knowledge about how to improve school governance to provide the best possible educational outcomes for students. Each year we conduct elections for school council. Parents and Department of Education and Training (DET) members are elected for a period of two years. Community members can also be co-opted to school council for up to two years.

This year, there are 5 parent positions to be filled (2 years) and 1 DET positions.

If you would like to be involved in school council, which meets once a month (every third Thursday from 6:00 pm). Each member brings their own valuable skills and knowledge to the role. It is important to have an interest in your child's school and the desire to work in partnership with other school council members to help inform and shape direction of the school.

#### How do I nominate for the election?

If you decide to stand for election, collect a nomination form from the front office, or call and we will arrange to have one sent home with your child or sent electronically. Nominations open on Monday 12th February and close on Monday 19th February. Complete all details and return the form to school. A ballot will only be held if the number of nominations exceeds the number of vacant positions.

#### **Mobile Phones**

A reminder that the Department of Education has in place a mobile phone ban that requires students who bring mobiles phones to school to have them switched off and securely put away during school hours.

The department is requiring all schools to ensure this ban is in place and enforced from the start of the 2024 school year.

The ban applies equally to all government schools right across the state.

This helps ensure that school is a learning environment free from unnecessary distractions and disruptions.

By ensuring mobile phones are kept away at recess and lunch times, students can interact with each other face-to-face, without the distractions and social pressures that mobile phones can cause.

I ask for the support of all our families, staff and students in continuing to support the implementation of this policy in our school.

#### **Further information**

**Exceptions:** For a small number of students with particular health needs, an exception to the policy may be granted. Please contact an Assistant Principal if you would like to discuss this.

**Emergencies:** In the event of an emergency or if you need to immediately contact your child, I ask that families contact the school office who will pass on a message as required.

**Parent support:** The Mobile phones in schools webpage provides links to resources for families to help them balance their children's time using mobile phones.

If you have further questions, please contact the administration office.

#### **Child Safe Standards**

We are committed to providing a child safe environment. We want the students of Cambridge to be safe and to feel safe. It is also important that their voices are heard about decisions that affect their lives. ## THE FIRST TWO WEEKS BACK

Prepare Visual Aids: Utilise visual schedules, charts, or cues to help your child understand and anticipate daily activities. Visual aids can provide a clear structure, reducing anxiety and promoting independence.


