## **WELLBEING AND INCLUSION**



At school we review our school data often to determine what issues are happening in class and in the yard so that we can be proactive and reduce the amount of times these issues are occurring. We also create explicit lessons during our Social Emotional Learning (SEL) sessions each week.

One issue that is coming up a lot across the school is students becoming upset, angry, or annoyed with another student during the break and then not being able to manage those emotions. This is leading to situations of students pushing, hitting, kicking each other, and becoming very escalated and very upset. The amount of time that teachers and leaders in the school are having to spend addressing these issues is impacting learning time.

To address this, we have come up with a whole school definition of consent. This definition is aimed at supporting students to understand that we need permission before touching someone or their belongings.

We encourage you to continue this conversation at home as well. The more that students hear their teachers and their families using the same language – the more likely it is they will understand it and follow it.

You can print this poster and have it in display at home. It may help to resolve issues that occur between siblings.

#### LOTE




