FIRST AID

PURPOSE

To ensure the school community understands our school's approach to first aid for students.

SCOPE

First aid for anaphylaxis and asthma are provided for in our school's:

- Anaphylaxis Policy
- Asthma Policy
- This policy does not include information on first aid requirements for COVID-19. Our school follows the Department's operational guidance for first aid management relating to COVID-19.

POLICY

From time to time Cambridge Primary School staff might need to administer first aid to students at school or school activities.

Parents/carers should be aware that the goal of first aid is not to diagnose or treat a condition.

Staffing

The Principal will ensure that Cambridge Primary School has sufficient staff with the appropriate levels of first aid training to meet the first aid needs of the school community.

Our school's trained first aid officers are listed in our Emergency Management Plan (EMP). Our EMP includes the expiry dates of the training.

This list is reviewed as our trained first aid Officers updated their training.

First aid kits

Cambridge Primary School will maintain:

- A major first aid kits which will be stored in the First Aid Room and in each of our Warden's Rooms
- 4 Large, 6 excursion and 5 Yard duty portable first aid kits which may be used for excursions, camps, or yard duty.

The portable first aid kits will be stored: First Aid Room

First Aid Officer will be responsible for maintaining all first aid kits, ensuring they are managed in accordance with the Department's policy and guidance on first aid kits – refer to <u>First aid kits</u>

Care for ill students

Students who are unwell should not attend school.

If a student becomes unwell during the school day they may be directed to the sick bay and monitored by staff. Depending on the nature of their symptoms, staff may contact parents/carers or an emergency contact person to ask them to collect the student.

First aid room/Sick Bay area

Our school follows the Department's policy and guidance in relation to our first aid room/sick bay area to ensure it is safe, hygienic and appropriately equipped: <u>First aid rooms and sick bays</u>.

First aid management

If there is a situation or incident which occurs at school or a school activity which requires first aid to be administered to a student:

- Staff who have been trained in first aid will administer first aid in accordance with their training. In an emergency, other staff may assist in the administration of first aid within their level of competence.
- Parents of ill children will be contacted to take the children home.
- All School Camps will have at least one First Aid trained staff member attend.
- All children, especially those with documented asthma management plans, will have access to Asthma Inhalers and a spacer at all times.
- A member of staff is responsible for the purchase and maintenance of first aid supplies, first aid kits, ice packs and the general upkeep of the first aid room.
- At the commencement of each year, requests for updated first aid information will be sent home including requests for any asthma and anaphylaxis management plans.
- In a medical emergency, staff may take emergency action and do not need to obtain parent/carer consent to do so. Staff may contact Triple Zero "000" for emergency medical services at any time.
- Staff may also contact NURSE-ON-CALL (on 1300 60 60 24) in an emergency situation. NURSE-ON-CALL provides immediate, expert health advice from a registered nurse and is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
- If first aid is administered for a minor injury or condition, Cambridge Primary School will notify parents/carers by entering it on Compass which sends a notification to Primary Contacts.
- If first aid is administered for a serious injury or condition, or in an emergency situation, school staff will attempt to contact parents/carers or emergency contacts as soon as reasonably practical.
- If staff providing first aid determine that an emergency response is not required but that
 medical advice is needed, school staff will ask parents/carers, or an emergency contact
 person, to collect the student and recommend that advice is sought from a medical
 practitioner.

- Whenever first aid treatment is administered to a student resulting from a student incident, injury or illness, Cambridge Primary School will:
 - o record the provision of care on eduSafe Plus. If the care is provided following a recorded incident, the details are recorded through the eduSafe Plus *Incident* form.
 - o if care was provided in response to a medical emergency or reportable incident, follow the Department's Reporting and Managing School Incidents Policy, including reporting the incident to the Department's Incident Support and Operations Centre on 1800 126 126 where required to under that policy.

It is recommended that all Students have ambulance cover

In accordance with Department of Education and Training policy, analgesics, including paracetamol and aspirin, will not be stored at school, or provided as a standard first aid treatments. This is because they can mask signs of serious illness or injury. For further information refer to the Department's Policy and Advisory Library: Medication

Prescribed medication will only be administered if a Medication Authority Form has been provided to the school, excluding Paracetamol and Nurofen.
