For parents and carers (primary) Support to keep your children safe online

This guide provides tips and resources for parents, carers and families to support children to be safe when using social media.

Primary school aged children and social media

Parents and carers play a key role in guiding their children as they navigate the online world and begin to learn through exploration, play and social interaction.

Parents and carers can prepare their primary school aged child to be safe on social media even if they don't use it yet. You can do this by building good online habits and staying informed about online safety.

You can learn more how to help your child begin their online journey on the <u>eSafety</u> Commissioner's website.

You can also learn about the range of social media, games, apps and sites in the <u>eSafety</u> <u>Guide</u>, including what all the apps are, their minimum age requirements, how to protect personal information and how to report content within the apps themselves.



Supporting positive and safe online experiences for your child

There are a range of resources available to support you to support your child to have a safe experience online.

- The eSafety Commissioner's website provides:
 - eSafety parents page including: information on how to have hard conversations about tricky topics like cyberbullying or seeing pornography.
 - webinars to give parents/carers the knowledge, skills and tools to support safe online experiences including supporting primary schools children to understand consent and online boundaries and how to support your child with online gaming.
 - family friendly videos and advice sheets in multiple languages to support your family stay safe online, getting started with social media, safer online gaming and getting help when your child is bullied online.
 - eSafetykids page with child friendly information you can share with your child including what to do when someone is being mean online, being safe online, sharing photos and personal information online.
- <u>Bully Stoppers</u> provides dedicated resources on <u>cybersafety and cyberbullying</u> for primary aged students and a dedicated resource page for <u>parents</u>. You can also access <u>cyberbullying</u> <u>advice sheets</u> for concerned adults through <u>Bully Stoppers</u>.
- Alannah and Madeline Foundation provides <u>DigiTalk</u>, an online safety hub for parents. It includes resources on topics such as becoming a screen smart family, navigating online bullying, and choosing, protecting and engaging with games for children.
- Raising Children Network provides resources for parents of primary school children on topics like healthy screen time, digital family life, digital play and learning and online safety.

CURRICULUM NEWS

At Cambridge Primary School, we pride ourselves on delivering a rich and comprehensive educational experience, aligned with the Victorian Curriculum. Our curriculum not only supports students in gaining essential skills but also encourages critical thinking, creativity, and personal growth. This term, we're focusing on revising several key areas that lay the foundation for lifelong learning.

Literacy: Building Strong Readers and Writers

In our classrooms, literacy is a cornerstone of development. From exploring CVC words and initial sounds in the early years to enhancing decoding, comprehension, and fluency in Year 1, we provide students with the tools they need to become confident readers and writers. This term, students are engaging in revising and bringing together the skills they have learnt throughout the year in their writing and reading.

Numeracy: Strengthening Number Sense and Place Value

Numeracy skills are equally prioritised, with a focus on number sense and place value from Foundation to the higher levels. At the Foundation level, we've designed engaging lessons around addition, subtraction, and place value to give students a solid understanding of how numbers work together. Through activities like bundling and regrouping, students gain a concrete understanding of the base-10 system.

For our younger students, we're concentrating on building fluency with two-digit numbers, emphasizing bundling and regrouping without relying heavily on technology. By using tactile materials such as counters and blocks, we ensure that students grasp these concepts deeply and in a way that they can apply to real-world situations.

Supporting Every Learner

We understand that each student is unique, and our curriculum supports all learning styles. Whether your child excels in mathematics, enjoys literacy, or has a special interest in the arts, our teachers are committed to tailoring lessons to meet their individual needs.

This term is an exciting time for both students and teachers at Cambridge Primary School and we look forward to seeing our students thrive as they continue their learning journey.


